



Student Lanyards and Dress Code in Sixth Form

Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

This year, all sixth form students have been issued with lanyards to wear at all times on the school site. The primary reason for this is for safeguarding. The students do not wear the same uniform as lower school and therefore, they can blend in very well with members of staff and visitors to the school.

Recent safeguarding issues on school sites around the country have highlighted the importance of all staff and students being able to tell immediately whether people on the school campus are meant to be there.

Sadly, many students are failing to wear their lanyards, despite requests from staff. Therefore, the decision has been made that students will not be allowed on the school site unless they are wearing their lanyard. This rule will be enforced from Monday 22nd May.

If students have lost their lanyard/pass, they are able to purchase a new one. To do this, they need to take their money to the student office and then collect the new passes from Mrs Cutting in the 6th form office.

The costs are: £0.50 for a new lanyard
£0.50 for a new card holder
£2 for a new electronic photo pass.

We would be grateful for your help and support with this matter.

This is also a good opportunity to remind everyone of the dress code for sixth formers. Our dress code policy is for clothing to be smart, modest and appropriate for a school environment. Details are on the back of this letter.

SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE 2017-18

There is no formal uniform for sixth form but we expect students to adopt a mature approach which reflects the high standards expected of them in a working environment.

Please accept the following guidance in relation to the sixth form dress code.

Boys: A collared shirt with smart trousers; ties are optional although many boys choose to wear one and they look great.

V or crew neck jumper.

Polo shirts and long, smart, tailored shorts are acceptable in the summer term.

Denim blue jeans, casual trousers, shorts, cargo trousers, logos, hoodies or heavily patterned items are not appropriate.

No flip flops or trainers.

Girls: Blouses, smart tops with smart trousers, skirts or dresses, cardigans or smart jumpers.

Blue denim, casual style trousers, bomber jackets, miniskirts, leggings or crop/strappy tops or tops with heavy decoration/sequins are not acceptable.

No flip flops or trainers.

Jewellery: Items of jewellery must be appropriate to a working environment. Small nose studs for sixth formers are acceptable but no other facial piercing should be worn.
